The Challenge

Facility delivery is challenging

Concept to delivery time – over 10 years

Projects are complex

Limited funding c.\$26m

Increasing building costs including inflation

Extensive number of partly funded facilities

Growth and diversity



Where we are now?

50 projects have some funding

Total cost of these projects is c.\$316 million

Total funding secured c.\$93 million

13 projects which have over 50% - still \$24 million shortfall

c.\$26 million available annually

Sector funding landscape challenging



Change is required

The Facility Priority Plan

Delivered by end April 2024

Identify which projects are a priority for delivery over the next 1-3 and 4-6-year time frame

A flexible plan that will change over time and respond to new projects

A plan to help inform funders

Drive delivery of priority projects and create a pipeline

A document the sector can use
