

- Lowest cost refreshments in the area, benchmarked regularly



- Fleet Racing with Summer Series, Evening Series, Winter Series and Ladies Races
- Hosted the 2023 Pied Piper Intergalactics and will be hosting their 2024 event
- We have our own Pied Piper "Triumph" with priority given to our younger members to use and are encouraged to race in club races.




#### Fundraising partnerships


MCC is proud to support local fundraising efforts.

In 2023 we hosted multiple events and raised 10s of thousands supporting groups such as Woven Earth, Women's Refuge, Flood relief groups, local schools, Junior Sailing program and many more with innovative profit sharing.





- Flood in January 2023 over half a million dollars in cost to date, still being reconciled
- Addition of the Ice Cream and Coffee Kiosk Oct 23 which has resulted in a community tie-in and venue hire
- Largest 420 schools sailing program on the shore (by purchasing unused 420s)
- Adult LTS program has been a hit
- 300% increase in junior sailing program from 0-5 schools sailing using 9 x 420s
- Pied Piper being used by members gateway to keel boats
- MCC selected as the new home of the Ocean Swim Series
- The "Milford Boozing Club" reputation is almost non-existent now

#### What we do well

Engage and communicate with non-members (translating to more venue bookings and memberships)

We are an information hub for the locals as it relates to the Milford area (significantly less complaints from locals)

Built exceptional relationships with council and alcohol district licensing (last minute events and use of the reserve not an issue)

Engaging and working with local businesses (who effectively advertise the clubs great facilities)

Venue hire (eg turning around a single room up to 3 times in a single day)

We are finding that the public/non-members are recommending us for functions and previous members are returning



#### What we do well

Keeping our membership prices and member alcohol prices lower than any other boating club with a licensed bar

Engaging the members with a variety of offerings including quiz nights, live music, theme nights, constant change is needed

Providing our facilities for free to charities/not for profit/fundraising

Everything in the office is run by 1.5 paid office staff

Largest youth employer outside the supermarkets with the kitchen and the kiosk – resulting in increased community buy in

Supporting local schools with fundraising and training which has enabled them to succeed at the Inter Dominion Championships. The parents of these competitors are often successful sailors and not members of the MCC, and love to socialize there.

We will continue to focus on community engagement, as we continue to rebuild our club and set our sights on promoting more family members and grow the club for the next generation.
